

Dear Parent/Carer

As you will have seen from the communication from the Bradgate Education Partnership Trust, Wreake Valley Academy and Bradgate Sixth Form will be gradually increasing the provision for students from within Years 10 and 12 from the week commencing June 8th.

In line with the advice received from the DfE, this will take the form of some face to face input from teaching staff each week which will support the learning that is currently being set online.

For the weeks beginning the 8th and 15th June, this will take the following form:

Year 10	Mon - Wed	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Year 10 will be split into 3 cohorts.</li> <li>Each cohort will be divided into 5 groups of 7 or 8 students.</li> <li>Cohorts will attend one day a week with a staggered start to the beginning and end of the session.</li> <li>Students will be taught in these groups and will not mix with other students. Unfortunately, we will not be in a position to change the composition of student groups due to minimising the remixing of groups.</li> <li>Classrooms have been set up to adhere to the 2-meter social distancing.</li> <li>Break times will also be staggered to ensure social distancing between groups.</li> <li>More detailed information will be sent to you after half term.</li> </ul>
Year 12	Thurs - Fri	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Year 12 students will be taught in their subject groups.</li> <li>These will be timetabled based on the timetable blocks and each subject area will have a staggered start to the beginning and end of the session.</li> <li>Students will only take part in one subject on any one day to avoid the remixing of groups on any particular day.</li> <li>More detailed information will be sent to you after half term.</li> </ul>

We have spent the last two weeks planning and adjusting our site to account for the latest advice from central government and Public Health England. Whilst we will take every precaution and risk mitigation measure that is open to us, we also acknowledge that we can only ever reduce risk and not eradicate it entirely. Therefore, whilst attendance is encouraged on the specified days, there will be no enforcement action taken where parents decide to continue to access the learning from home.

These are our plans as they stand today, we will try to minimise any changes, however, as you will appreciate the guidance from government is constantly updated and we will continue to follow this guidance and if changes are necessary then these will be made and you will be informed.

We will write to you with more details week commencing 1<sup>st</sup> June.
