 A job for people ages 16+ with a training programme attended by the apprentice in an educational establishment.

 A paid contract of employment with a company.

When looking for an apprenticeship, it is important to look at the different levels of apprenticeships and their entry requirements to understand which level of apprenticeship you should be applying for.

Apprenticeship frameworks are all different so ensure you do your research-if you are uncertain seek guidance.
